Oberammergau 2022

After postponement of this trip from 2020 due to Covid, an expectant and excited group of 21 persons, including 4 members from Williamwood Church eventually met at Edinburgh Airport on Wednesday 7th. September 2022. Our very own Rev. Jan Mathieson was our Group Leader and had been responsible for arranging meetings and overseeing travel arrangements over the months leading up to our departure.

Having flown from Edinburgh to Frankfurt to Munich and then travelled by coach to Arzl in Austria we were glad to eventually reach our Hotel destination. Our beautiful accommodation was set in a quiet location surrounded by mountains and overlooking a very picturesque village. We felt very much at home as it rained for the first 2 days!

However this did not deter us from activities and we became so aware of the scenic beauty of the Tyrol. The hotel staff were very hospitable and during the Tyrolean evening organised within the hotel we took the opportunity to get to know each other, joining in with singing, eating, dancing and toasting the occasion. Prost!

We visited various museums, abbeys and a monastery and on the Saturday joined in a parade in a local village where the animals are led down from the hills to be more sheltered during the winter. The village was bathed in sunshine and the colourful costumes of the village people, music, beer, food, sound of cow bells all brought a great feeling of ambience to the day.

On the Sunday we departed for Oberammergau in Bavaria to watch the Passion Play qwhich is performed every 10 years by the people of this village to fulfil their oath made to God in 1633. The performance lasts 5 hours. The first half is in daylight and over 1,000 villagers can be on stage at any one time. We then had a 3 hour break for dinner at our overnight hotel and watched the second half in the evening. We had excellent seats (3 rows from the front of stage) and it was a real privilege to share in with the faithfulness of the villagers and to experience our own varied emotions as we watched spectacular scenes depicting the entry of Jesus into Jerusalem and up until his Resurrection.


Before returning to Austria the following day we spent a few hours shopping in the village and meeting and speaking to the shop-keepers and staff in the cafes, restaurants and hotels many of whom had taken part in the Play the day before. The Play is performed 5 times weekly from May to the end of September. An amazing feat.

Our holiday was almost at an end. Fantastic scenery, warm fellowship with others, great hospitality, excursions, walks, beer, Apfelstrudel, and faithfulness to name but a few of the things which will make this a Trip to remember for many years to come. An invitation to hear and see more about this trip is extended to all visitors and Church members on Tuesday November 29th. in the Church between 2-4pm. when Margaret and Jean will do a presentation to The Guild.
