Advent Book and Discussion Group



We've just heard the good news the Rev Beckie will remain at Williamwood for another 6 months but in a new capacity as Assistant Minister and with a wider role that will see her serving throughout the Cluster. She is likely to be in Carnwadric one day a week and possibly at Eastwood for an afternoon. She will also take services in other congregations in our cluster as

well as at Williamwood. We're likely to see less of her but its good Williamwood remains as her base.

Sometimes it is possible to become a member by asking the Kirk Session to allow your name to be added to our Roll.

The Minister is happy to discuss these options with anyone who would like to explore communicant membership.

Presbytery Planning and Cluster Progress

At the time of writing, we are still waiting to receive the response of the relevant '121' Committee to the Presbytery Plan submitted by Glasgow Presbytery which, of course, includes our Cluster and its plan. On Monday 5th December from 7-9pm our Cluster is having a meeting in Williamwood Hall for up to 10 congregational representatives from each of the 8 cluster congregations. This will continue the process of getting to know one another and will enable us to spend some time together thinking about what ministry and mission and congregational life may look like as the Plan is implemented over a 5–10-year period when the number of Ministers of Word and Sacrament may reduce to 3 to serve the whole cluster.
