Rev Beckie Bartocho

Her last Sunday with us at Williamwood will be Sunday 4th June.

Her new placement begins on 3rd July though she does not know where this will be yet.

Presbytery Plan Update

At meetings on 25th and 26th April Glasgow Presbytery approved the Presbytery Mission Plan it had devised. (You can see this Plan on the Presbytery of Glasgow website)

The Glasgow Presbytery Plan is now sent to the General Trustees and the Faith Nurture Forum in Edinburgh. These bodies may agree the Plan or may send it back with a request for revision. Only when the Plan is finally agreed by all parties does its implementation begin.

Within the Plan, Williamwood Parish Church is in Zone 4 and we are part of the ARC Churches cluster comprising 8 congregations.

We have said that decisions about the future of all buildings within the Cluster will be taken by December 2024 or one year after the final approval of the Plan. That timescale means discussions will need to begin quite soon.

The Cluster is hoping to arrange a meeting for Ministers and a few office-bearers from each congregation in the Cluster before the summer to start to think about a way forward.

Doors open/ warm spaces

It has been decided to continue this on one day per week throughout May and June. We will operate in the Session House on a Tuesday from 10.00 till 12.00.



The weather has improved and it is felt that folks might want to meet friends at the benches outside the front doors of the church. Obviously if you are doing this you would need to bring your own tea or coffee.



Fairtrade

There will be a Fairtrade stall in the hall after church on 14th May. As we have not had a stall since March we are hoping to see lots of people for a catch up.

Coffee after Church

This is a very worthwhile and appreciated service enjoyed by everyone who attends, and we very much want to continue this. Unfortunately the teams for the coffee after church have reduced a bit but it is hoped this is a temporary measure. Those who are filling up the gaps are



doing this more frequently, and it is becoming a bit of a strain. There will inevitably be more gaps in this service especially over the summer months, again hopefully not too many.

There are at present the beginnings of another team with three people and it would be great if another two can volunteer to join them. Speak to Aileen Montgomery if you would like to volunteer to join this group.

The teams who serve out tea and coffee also donate the biscuits, milk and whatever else is needed on the day. They are there setting up before 10.30am and clearing away until after 1.00pm. They could not do this without the help of the duty teams and younger people who help with the heavy lifting of tables and chairs when they can.

Any donations received for coffee after church are given to several different organizations, including our own church and to cover some of the costs of coffee, tea and heating etc. If you can help out in any way or wish to suggest other recipients for donations please let Aileen Montgomery know.
