Our speaker on 27th November will be from Home for Good, one of the Guild projects. Home for Good is a charity with a vision to find a home for every vulnerable child who needs one. In Scotland, over 10,000 children are looked after away from home. The charity is working to keep fostering, adoption and supported lodgings on the mainstream of hundreds of churches across Scotland.


We will be putting up the external decorations at **1.00pm on 3rd December** and would be grateful for any help

Presbytery Planning

2 representatives from each congregation in our Cluster had a meeting on 11th October and will meet again on 22nd November. They began to consider what ministry and mission might look like in a cluster which covers a large geographical area and where the number of Ministers of Word and Sacrament will reduce from the current 8 to 3.

Arrangements for the union of Eastwood and Thornliebank congregations are progressing with the Union likely to take place in the very early part of 2024 The Rev Mike Gargrave (of Thornliebank) retired on 31st October

The timescale for the implementation of the Plan continues to be by 2027 though before that we must decide on the designations of buildings (by the end of 2024) and expect that ministers in reviewable charges (such as Williamwood) will not be in current posts beyond the end of 2025 (though in some cases they may continue to serve in their current clusters)

MOVIES TO MUSICALS – Saturday 17th February 2024 in the Clyde Auditorium (Armadillo) (Glasgow Philharmonia SCIO SC047789)

Most of you will know Ross Gunning who spent the first 17 years of his life in the church at creche, Sunday School and Boys Brigade. Ross played percussion in various orchestras and at the Junior Conservatoire every Saturday from the age of 12. In 2012 when he was 17, I asked him if he could put on a concert with a few musician friends to raise money for Kwenderana to build a classroom block at Ekwendeni Primary School. Ross also wanted to be an orchestra conductor so got together an orchestra of 45 young musicians and they put on a concert in Greenbank Church which raised £1500. Ross conducted this concert and went on to study conducting as part of his music degree. The young musicians enjoyed it so much, they asked Ross if he could continue the orchestra so that they could play together. In 2015 he put on a concert with the orchestra and singers in Glasgow City Halls which was called Movies to Musicals and it was a sell-out. He has continued this each year in February and included a Kids Cast, Musical Theatre Cast and Professional Soloists. The concerts have been in the Glasgow Royal Concert Hall, The Alhambra in Dunfermline and in 2023, the Theatre Royal in Glasgow. For the last few years in September, they have played at smaller venues and this year they had sell out performances at Eastwood Theatre and The Beacon in Greenock.

In August this year they put on the under 18's edition of Les Miserable at Greyfriars Kirk and sold out 5 performances.

Next year is the 10th Anniversary Concert and Ross has decided to move to a larger venue so has booked The Clyde Auditorium. There will be an orchestra, kids cast and adult cast with a choir. The professional soloists are West End stars Kerry Ellis, Sabrina Carter and Paul Tabone and the show will include some of the highlights of the last 10 years.

Becoming a Communicant Member of Williamwood Parish Church

Sometimes it is possible to become a member by asking the Kirk Session to allow your name to be added to our Roll.

The Minister is happy to discuss these options with anyone who would like to explore communicant membership.
