PRESBYTERY PLANNING /CLUSTER NEWS

Minister members of our Cluster Group continue to meet weekly.

2 representatives from each congregation in our Cluster will meet for a third time on 24th January.

In all of this, we continue to try to discern the future shape of ministry and mission in a large geographical area with a reducing number of Ministers of Word and Sacrament. Currently, there is a delay in the process of the Union between Eastwood and Thornliebank due to some concerns (about buildings!) raised by the General Trustees and the national committee dealing with presbytery planning.

DOORS OPEN has had a two month trial period. The view of members hosting is that it has been successful and as a result we are continuing with Doors Open on Thursday from 10 till 12 noon.

BECOMING A COMMUNICANT MEMBER OF WILLIAMWOOD PARISH CHURCH
