PRESBYTERY PLANNING

The Kirk Session of Giffnock: Orchardhill has decided to leave our Cluster and is now seeking presbytery approval for this action. It leaves our Cluster with 7 congregations. Cluster representatives met on 29th May in Williamwood and it was agreed that the 7 Kirk Sessions should consider writing to the Presbytery's committee responsible for implementing the Presbytery Plan to ask how this decision will affect the ministerial allocation to our Cluster and for consideration to be given to leaving the allocation at 3 ministers and a 0.5 post associated with the urban priority status of two of our congregations. Our Kirk Session will meet to consider the draft letter soon.

In the meantime, the Cluster (of 7) continues to think about how ministry and mission will be carried out as the number of ministers reduces. Our Kirk Session has expressed a preference for a Team Ministry model for all seven congregations and is keen that the details of how this would be achieved and would operate are worked out as soon as possible.

In the meantime, it is proposed that as a 'getting to know one another' project a Cluster Olympics is to be held in the late summer. We're looking for two or three representatives from Williamwood to be on the organising committee joining a similar number of representatives from the other congregations.

CHURCH GARDENING


The Gardening group met at the end of May and had a busy first evening tidying up after the long winter months.
