THE BOYS' BRIGADE - UPDATE NOVEMBER 2024

Apologies for not sending updates for inclusion in the Church Newsletter, not sure where the time has gone, and possibly got out of the habit of doing these things. The BB, as you may have seen at the recent Remembrance Service has seen a drop in numbers, especially at the older age group. However, we are enthused to have a good number in the younger Anchor Boys and Junior Section which gives us encouragement for the future. New members are always welcome, so if you know of any boys in the local area, or beyond, of school age, please tell them that The Boys' Brigade in Williamwood is something they should enquire about.

The purpose of this article is to inform the congregation of a joint initiative that the wider BB (UK and Ireland) is working on to support Rotary International. As many of you may recall, our former Captain and Honorary Captain, the late Alistair K Denholm, was an active member of this organisation, one of many good causes that he supported. It was therefore fitting that the 128th got involved with this. Rotary International have been working hard to eradicate Polio, and since they started this project in the 1985, they have achieved this in 123 countries where it was endemic. There are now only two countries left (with the noted odd case that appears due to migration in the troubles), Pakistan and Afghanistan, where Polio is classed as endemic, and Rotary International is endeavouring to make Polio the second human disease that man has been able to eradicate from the world! Polio mainly affects children under the age of 5, but the consequences will affect the rest of that person's life. For the sake of a 20p immunisation, their "Purple 4 Polio" campaign will potentially improve the life of over 2.5 billion children globally who have already been immunised.

So why 'Purple'? When the children come to be immunised, the nurses dip their pinky finger in purple ink, so they can know who has been immunised that day, ensuring they don't get a second dose, and that those who are still to receive the vaccine do so. If you are entering the Church Halls you will now see a new planter to the left of the door (pics attached) that our Anchor Boys have planted crocus bulbs in, on the understanding that these will all be purple and in the spring time we will be able to see the flowers bloom and remember why we planted them in support of this worthwhile cause. The 128th has also raised over £100 to donate to this campaign. The Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation is helping with 2-to-1 donation matching, so this donation will be worth over £300 to Rotary International. This is effectively in excess of 1500 immunisations that we will be providing for children.
