Update from Forbes Barron, Property Convenor.

Property wise, the 'baton' as Convener has passed on from Stuart Young to Forbes Barron and Douglas Goudie (Vice Convener). The reconfigured and refreshed Property Team (Forbes, Douglas, Stuart and David Ratcliffe as well as input at the church from Wally Black and Tony Drysdale (plus any volunteers please..!) are busy finalising the arrangements for completion of the upgrade of all electrical installations in the Church, halls and annex.

As a church, we have already completed around half the works, and the remaining works have been facilitated by a grant of £21,997.50 from the East Renfrewshire Renewable Energy Fund. (87.5% of the cost of works remaining) allowing the very welcome completion and upgrade. This major grant came after an excellent team effort from a small number of office bearers over the past six months to obtain this external funding and now allows the completion of the comprehensive upgrade.

The East Renfrewshire Renewable Energy Fund aims to help projects that benefit East Renfrewshire communities. The money comes from renewable energy projects in East Renfrewshire. East Renfrewshire Council run the fund with contributions from:

- Scottish Power Renewables
- Whitelee Windfarm
- Middleton Windfarm

The boilers have just had their annual service and we have manged through the good services of Wally Black to 'nurse' a condensate pipe issue and small leak (now resolved) so that users have experienced no loss of heat during a the particularly recent cold spell of weather.

We continue with putting in place arrangements to allow us to rent out the vacant manse, following approval from Glasgow Presbytery for the rental. Arrangements are in place during the current vacancy to manage the property and its continued insurance. Trees at the rear of the manse which are overgrown and dead will also be shortly removed to avoid issues and the upcoming bird nesting season.

COFFEE AT ROUKEN GLEN


