### ***Sunday Worship***

### ***Church of Scotland General Assembly 2021***

The General Assembly of the Church of Scotland takes place on Saturday 22<sup>nd</sup> May and from Mon 24<sup>th</sup>-Thur 27<sup>th</sup> May and will be held online. Ross Johnstone and Margaret Robertson are both Commissioners to the General Assembly and will be able to speak and vote in debates

There is no cure for myositis but it can be controlled with drugs. They are taking me slowly off steroids which is a good thing and gradually weaning me onto another drug.

I was overwhelmed by the number of letters, gifts and cards. This helped to get through the bad days. As much as I would like to thank you all, I do hope you will accept a collective thank you. It was good of you to think of me during that long spell.” Anne

## **LODGING HOUSE MISSION**




### **Post-Easter Bible Study**
